- Certified teachers: 100%
- Student–teacher ratio: 16:1 (school average; state average is 17:1)
- Teacher Experience - Nearly half the faculty has over 20 years of teaching experience—a sign of strong institutional knowledge and stability among veteran staff.
 - 0–5 years: 13%
 - 6–10 years: 23%
 - 11–15 years: 13%
 - 16–20 years: 11%
 - 20+ years: 40%
- 6% turnover rate for Hamtramck High - departure of a few staff to administrative roles and retirement.

 - Hosts an annual Title I meeting where:
 - The Parent Involvement Plan and compact are introduced.
 - Title I services, curriculum standards, and ways to monitor progress are explained.
 - Workshops are provided on topics like technology safety, academic support, and understanding assessments.
 - These occur during Curriculum Night and are accompanied by at least three Parent–Teacher Conferences per year.
- Ongoing Communication & Accessibility
 - Teachers are available for parent meetings via phone, email, or in-person during planning periods.
 - All written information (e.g., assessment results, program plans) is provided in accessible formats and languages parents understand.
 - Parents can share feedback through surveys, informal communication, or participation in improvement teams.

 - The school partners with after-school programs (ACCESS) and external agencies to host events and support parental engagement.

10. School Climate and Culture

- Student attendance
 - chronic absenteeism rate of 41.3%
 - Michigan statewide chronic absenteeism rates generally hover 10–20%
 - Absenteeism negatively impacts HHS academic achievement and graduation odds.
- Discipline data summary
 - 10th grade students received the highest number of referrals.
 - African American (30%) and Middle Eastern (50%) students were overrepresented in ODR rates relative to their enrollment.
 - The data highlights inequities in disciplinary practices, particularly among students of color and those facing homelessness.
 - Advancing restorative justice models, equity training, and improved reporting transparency may help reduce exclusion and better support vulnerable students.

- Student and family engagement activities
 - Family Night #1 - A district-wide kickoff event including multilingual programming, interpreters, and facilitators to introduce Title I, the Parent & Family Engagement Plan, and available academic supports
 - Quarterly Family Engagement Meetings - Scheduled in fall and spring—alongside Open House, Title I meetings, Parent–Teacher Conferences, and academic workshops—to gather parent feedback, review the engagement plan, and offer support
 - Community Events & Fun Fairs - District-hosted gatherings (like summer fun fairs and literacy/math nights) that foster social connection and learning between families and school staff
